El Verbo Gustar

In Spanish, there is no verb for the phrase "to like." Instead, the verb gustar (to be pleasing) is used.

The most common forms of the verb gustar are "gusta" and "gustan."

The form of the verb gustar (gusta or gustan) does not depend on who does the liking, but depends on what is liked or what is pleasing.

El Verbo Gustar

When you want to talk about things that people like, change the form of Gustar to match the singular or plural nouns for those things.

Singular

me gusta

te gusta

le gusta + noun

nos gusta

os gusta

les gusta

Plural

me gustan

te gustan

le gustan + noun

nos gustan

os gustan

les gustan

El Verbo Gustar

To say that you don't like something, or that something does not please you, simply add "no" before me, te, le, les, os or nos.

No me gusta estudiar.

I don't like to study.

Studying does not please me.
