## Using the Verb OÍR

Like CONOCER and HACER, the verb OÍR (to hear) has an irregular "yo" form in the present tense.

- ✓ Some of its forms also require a **stem change** where the i becomes a y (boxes 2, 3, and 6).
- $\checkmark$  Note that *both* the **nosotros(as)**, **vosotros(as)** forms have accents.

yo	1. oi <b>go</b>	nosotros (as)	4. oímos
tú	2. o <u>v</u> es	vosotros (as)	5. <b>oí</b> s
él, ella, usted	3. o <u><b>y</b></u> e	ellos(as), ustedes	6. o <u>v</u> en

**OÍR**= to hear (do not confuse this verb with ESCUCHAR, which means *to listen* with intent)

You may hear the expression **¡Oye!** used throughout the dialog. It is used to get someone's attention, the way *Hey!* is used in English.

To get Isabel's attention, Ricardo might say: --¡Oye, Isabel! Or, Hey, Isabel!
