


# Saying what someone likes to do using “Gustar + Infinitive”



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You learned in Unidad 1 Etapa 1 how to say what somebody likes to do using:

| 1. <b>me gusta</b> | 4. <b>nos gusta</b> |
| 2. <b>te gusta</b> | 5. <b>os gusta</b>  |
| 3. <b>le gusta</b> | 6. <b>les gusta</b> |




Now, when you want to emphasize or specifically identify the person/thing/animal that likes to *do something*, use:

### noun

Personal “**a**” + **name** + **me, te, le, nos, os, les, gusta** + **infinitive pronoun** **verb**

These are the pronouns that follow the personal “**a**”:

1. a <b>mí</b> → <b>me gusta correr.</b>	4. a <b>nosotros(as)</b> → <b>nos gusta patinar.</b>
2. a <b>ti</b> → <b>te gusta bailar.</b>	5. a <b>vosotros(as)</b> → <b>os gusta ir de compras.</b>
3. a <b>él, ella, usted</b> → <b>le gusta leer.</b>	6. a <b>ellos(as), ustedes</b> → <b>les gusta ir al cine.</b>



To express that somebody likes a **person, place or thing (noun)** use:

me/te/le/nos/os/les **gusta** + **singular noun**

Me **gusta el muchacho** alto, moreno y guapo.

*I like the tall, dark, handsome **guy**.*

me/te/le/nos/os/les **gustan** + **plural noun**

A **ti te gustan las chicas pelirroja**.

*You like girls with short hair.*
