The Verb VENIR

Venir (to come) is similar to **Tener**, except that the **nosotros(as)** and **vosotros(as)** forms have **-ir** endings, while **tener** uses **-er** endings.

TENER (to have)

1. tengo	1. ten e mos
2. tienes	2. ten e ís
3. tiene	3. tienen



Venir (to come)

Pronombre	Singular	Pronombre	Plural
yó	vengo	nosotros(as)	venimos
tú	vienes	vosotros(as)	venís
él, ella, usted	viene	ellos(as), ustedes	vienen



Like IR (to go), VENIR (to come) can be used to express the present tense AND the present participle (relative future):

IR

Voy al parque.

I go to the park.

I am going to the park.

1. **VENIR a** = to come **to**
Ella viene **a** tu fiesta.
*She is coming **to** your party.*

VENIR

Vengo al parque.

I come to the park.

I am coming to the park.

2. **VENIR de** = to come **from**
Vengo **del** supermercado.
*I'm coming **from** the supermarket.*
